## ***SOLICITATION OF NOMINATIONS FOR ASIOA 2011 AWARDS***

ASIOA is delighted to announce its annual awards program for 2011. Nominations are invited from ASIOA members for the following categories: 1) Service Award, 2) Mario Toppo Distinguished Scientist Award, 3) Sudhir Gupta Young Scientist Award, and 4) Junior Scientist Awards. The Awards Committee will make the selections, and the Chief Guest at the ASIOA Annual Banquet will present the awards.

### **Criteria & Guidelines for Nominations**

1) **ASIOA Service Award** is given to a member of ASIOA, who has rendered outstanding service to the Association.

2) **Mario Toppo Distinguished Scientist Award** is given to an established senior scientist of Indian origin, who has made outstanding scientific contribution to the sciences.

3) **Sudhir Gupta Young Scientist Award** is given to a scientist of Indian origin who is 40 years or younger and has made exceptional contributions to science.

4) **Junior Scientist Awards** will be given to postdoctoral or predoctoral fellows of Indian origin. Separate Awards will be given as follows:

1. American Radiolabeled Chemicals Junior Scientist Award in **Pharmacology**
2. Biotex Laboratories Junior Scientist Award in **Immunology**
3. JOGUE Junior Scientist Award in **Nutrition**
4. Dr. Reddy's Laboratories Junior Scientist Award in **Molecular Biology**
5. Satu Somani Junior Scientist Award in **Physiology**
6. Gopal Krishna Memorial Junior Scientist Award in **Biochemistry**

### **How to apply**

Nominations for these categories should be made and seconded by ASIOA members in good standing. For Junior Scientists category, mentors who may or may not be ASIOA members can make nominations. Abstracts

submitted to Experimental Biology-2011 as a **first author** may also be considered for the Junior Scientist Awards by Awards Committee.

**Please send the nominations and supporting documents by email or regular mail by March 10, 2011 to the Awards Committee Chair. Late nominations will not be considered for the award.**

The nominees for all categories of award should be **paid-members of ASIOA, or should pay the annual dues after being nominated.** These awards are meant for Scientists of **Indian Origin** in America. **The awardees should be attending the banquet** to receive the awards.

The Awards Committee may decide not to confer an award in any category if suitable candidate(s) cannot be identified.

# 4<sup>th</sup> National Meeting of ASIOA

The Fourth National Meeting of ASIOA was held under the leadership of Dr. Avadhesh C. Sharma, President of ASIOA, Dr. Satya Kunapuli (Vice President) and Dr. Prasad Dhulipala (Secretary, ASIOA) at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine – School of Pharmacy in Suwanee, Georgia. Despite the week-long Atlanta winter storm, over 60 delegates from across the United States congregated in scholarly pursuit.

ASIOA was privileged to have Dr. George Chandy as the guest Inaugural Speaker during this meeting. Dr. Chandy is a

Professor at UC Irvine and the Director and Founder of Airmid Incorporated. Dr. Chandy delivered an exciting presentation entitled “*A Journey from Patient’s Bed to Bedside: Targeting Potassium Channels in T Cells as Therapy for Autoimmune Diseases*”. ASIOA was also privileged to have Dr. Muthu Periasamy as the Oration Speaker. Dr. Periasamy is Professor and Chair of Department of Physiology and Cell Biology at Ohio State University and is the Associate Director of the Davis Heart & Lung Research Institute. Dr. Periasamy delivered an insightful presentation on “*Sarcolipin: A Novel Target for Thermogenesis and Metabolism in Muscle*”. Dr. Chandy and Dr. Periasamy were honored at the meeting.

The scientific sessions were initiated by Immunology Appetizer Session chaired by Dr. Sudhir Gupta followed by diverse scientific sessions including: Cardiovascular Biology, Cancer Biology, Biomedical Research, Platelet Biology, and Drug Development. In addition to the senior researchers at the meeting, undergraduate, graduate, and post-doctoral students were able to present their research in the Junior Scientist Competition. Candidates presented their respective talks and posters in front of a panel of referees and were judged on the basis of scientific rigor, presentation style, a question and answer round.

Dr. John Fleichsmann, Executive Officer of Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine – Georgia Campus and Chief Guest for the meeting, presented the awards to the Junior Scientist Competition winners. The awards were selected by the referee panel that included Drs. Dhulipala, Sekar, Dudeja, Bhat and Reddy. We congratulate these Junior Scientists for their exceptional presentations and participation.

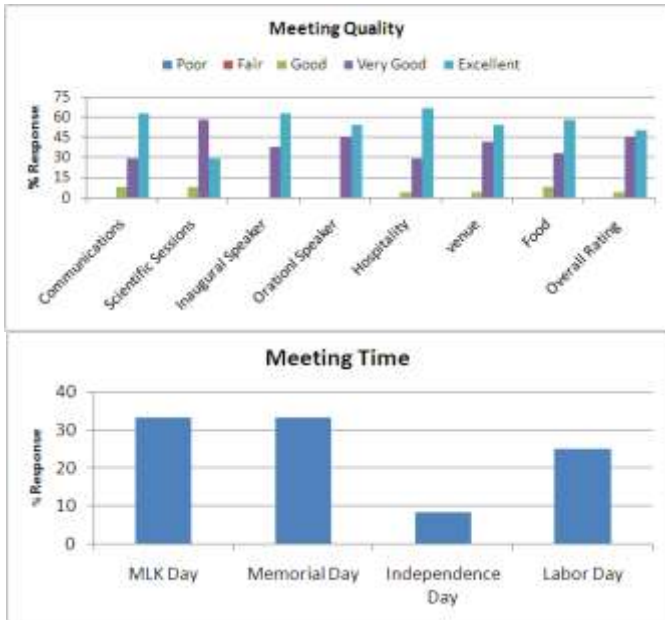

1. Please submit a) complete CV and b) a small CV that should have your key research interests. Please note that this will



## Cancer's foe

Dr. Manu Lopus discovered the molecular and cellular mechanism of action of DM1, the synthetic derivative of the microtubule-targeted agent, maytansine. Antibody-DM1 conjugates are being successful in clinical trials (For example, Trastuzumab-DM1 is showing promising results in treating HER2+ breast cancers). Manu published the work as two back-to-back papers in Molecular Cancer Therapeutics. It has received media coverage in news papers, local TV channels, and in several internet sites.
